

How much does it cost to splice a 6-core optical cable



Overview

For most commercial projects, expect to pay \$50-\$150 per fusion splice point - but that number can swing in either direction based on the factors below. Fiber optic splicing costs vary widely depending on project size, location, fiber type, and site conditions. The "per splice" rate is the most. I usually bill T&M, but it works out to about \$175-250 for setup/teardown per site and \$4-7 per fiber for prep in a new tray in an existing case and splicing depending on if it's flooded or dry cable. Main cost drivers include cable grade (indoor vs outdoor, armoured), distance, and labor for trenching, splicing, and termination. renting a splicer?

If you do >50 splices/month, buying pays off in 6-12 months. Q4: Do I need training to operate a fusion splicer?

Yes. Even with auto-machines, technique matters.
